### PE Days and Kits

On PE days (Wednesday and Fridays) children will come to school in their PE kit and remain in their PE kits all day.

PE kit is a white t-shirt, black shorts and plimsolls or trainers for outside. As the weather gets colder, children can wear their school sweatshirts over their t-shirt—NO hoodies, or branded clothing. Just the school sweatshirt or a school fleece.

### Forest School Days

On Forest School day (Thursday) children are to come to school in their uniform but ensuring that they have their arms and legs covered. As we move into Autumn and Winter, this shouldn't be a problem as the boys will be wearing trousers and jumpers and the girls wearing trousers or tights.

Children may bring an extra sweatshirt/fleece to add as an extra layer when it is cold. They will also need a weather appropriate coat.

No jewellery is to be worn on PE, Forest School or swimming days. If children are able to take out and put back in earrings on their own they may do so. If they are not able to, they should not wear earrings to school on these days. Taping over earrings is not permitted.

# Our learning this week...Early Years

## Music -

This week early years are exploring music we have been listening to an orchestra piece called the steam train. We used what we know about beat and tempo to gauge when the train was moving faster and when it was coming to the end of its journey and slowing down.

## Art -

We have explored colour mixing, We made new colours and our favourite colours by mixing together some of the colours we already had.

## P.E -

We practiced our over arm throwing this week, we practiced our stance, skill and retrieval.

## Maths -

Nursery have continued to consolidate our knowledge of numbers and quantity 1-5. Reception have focussed on subtraction with numbers up to 20. Nursery have continued our name sequencing and writing practice.

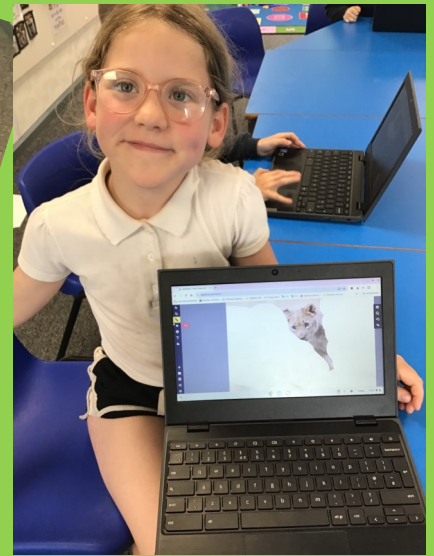
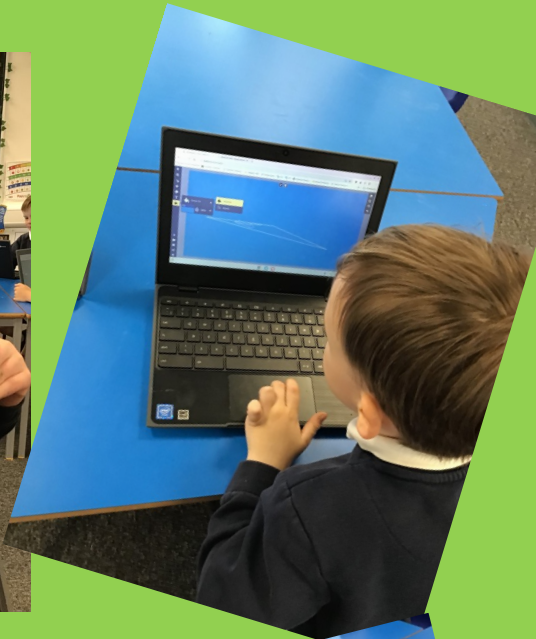
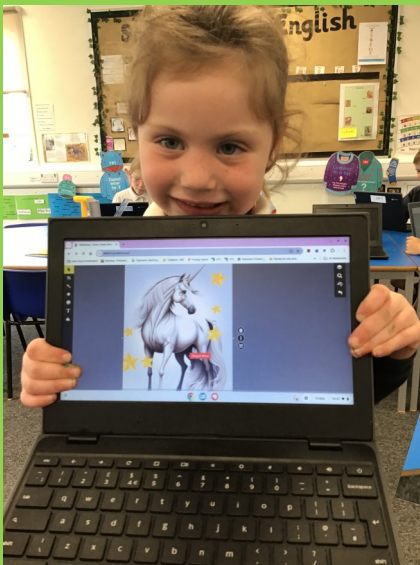


## Our Learning This Week.....Class 1
