PE Days and Kits

On PE days (Wednesday and Fridays) children will come to school in their PE kit and remain in their PE kits all day.

PE kit is a white t-shirt, black shorts and plimsolls or trainers for outside. As the weather gets colder, children can wear their school sweatshirts over their t-shirt—NO hoodies, or branded clothing. Just the school sweatshirt or a school fleece.

Forest School Days

On Forest School day (Thursday) children are to come to school in their uniform but ensuring that they have their arms and legs covered. As we move into Autumn and Winter, this shouldn't be a problem as the boys will be wearing trousers and jumpers and the girls wearing trousers or tights.

Children may bring an extra sweatshirt/fleece to add as an extra layer when it is cold. They will also need a weather appropriate coat.

No jewellery is to be worn on PE, Forest School or swimming days. If children are able to take out and put back in earrings on their own they may do so. If they are not able to, they should not wear earrings to school on these days. Taping over earrings is not permitted.

We discussed how we needed a variety of different foods within our diet and we created a rainbow of foods.

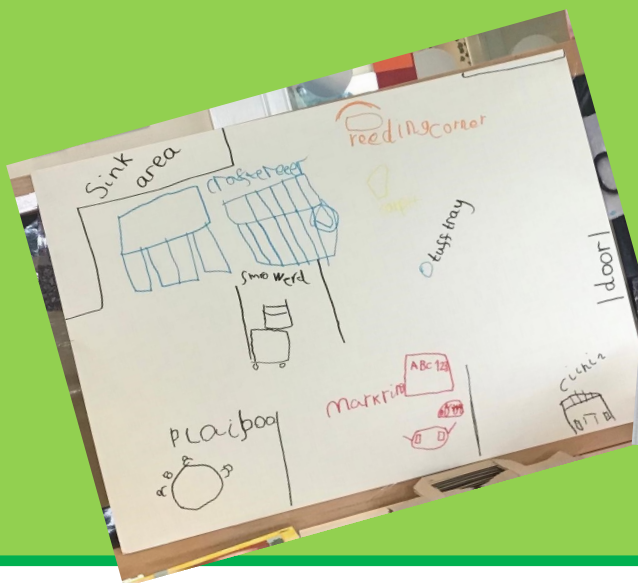
Phonics- Nursery have continued to practice their wonderful oral blending.

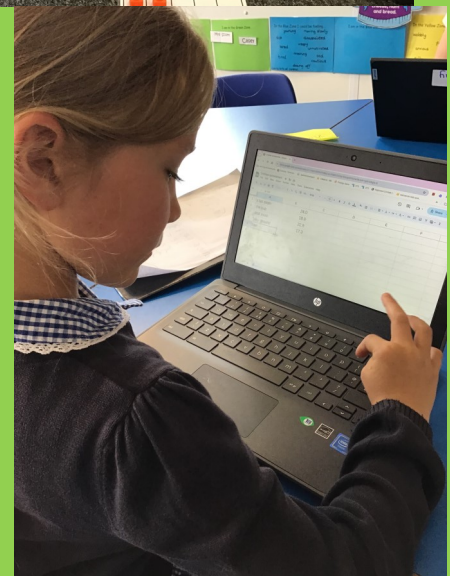
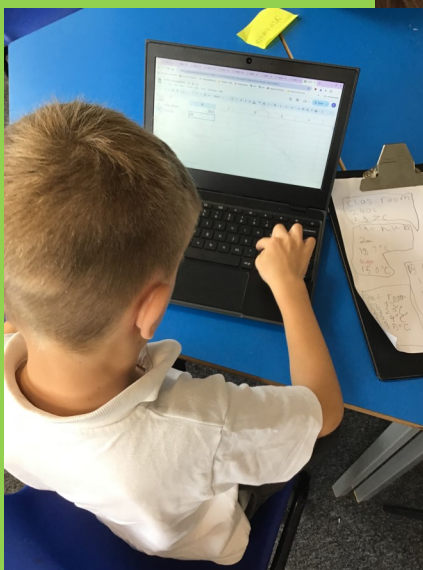
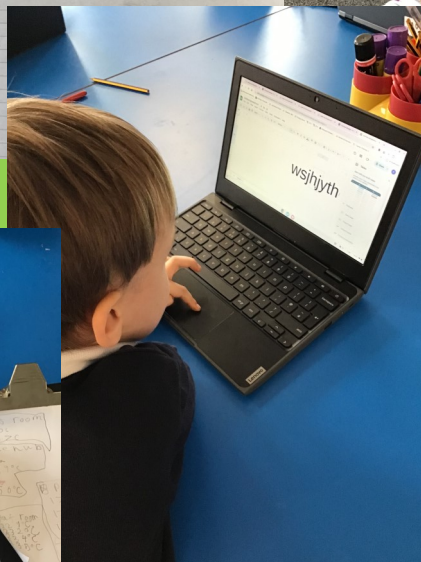
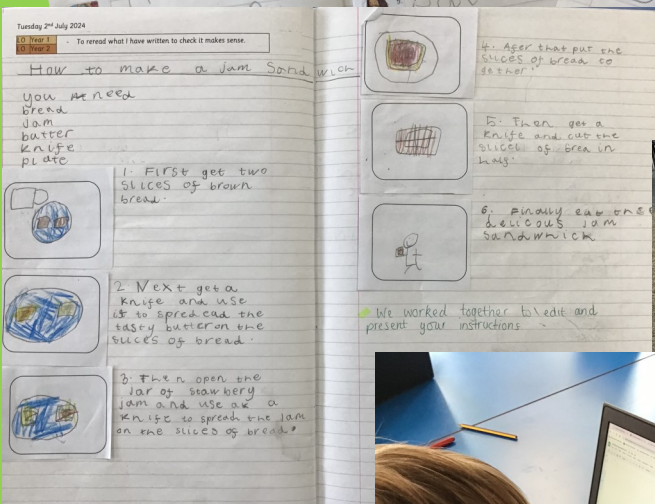
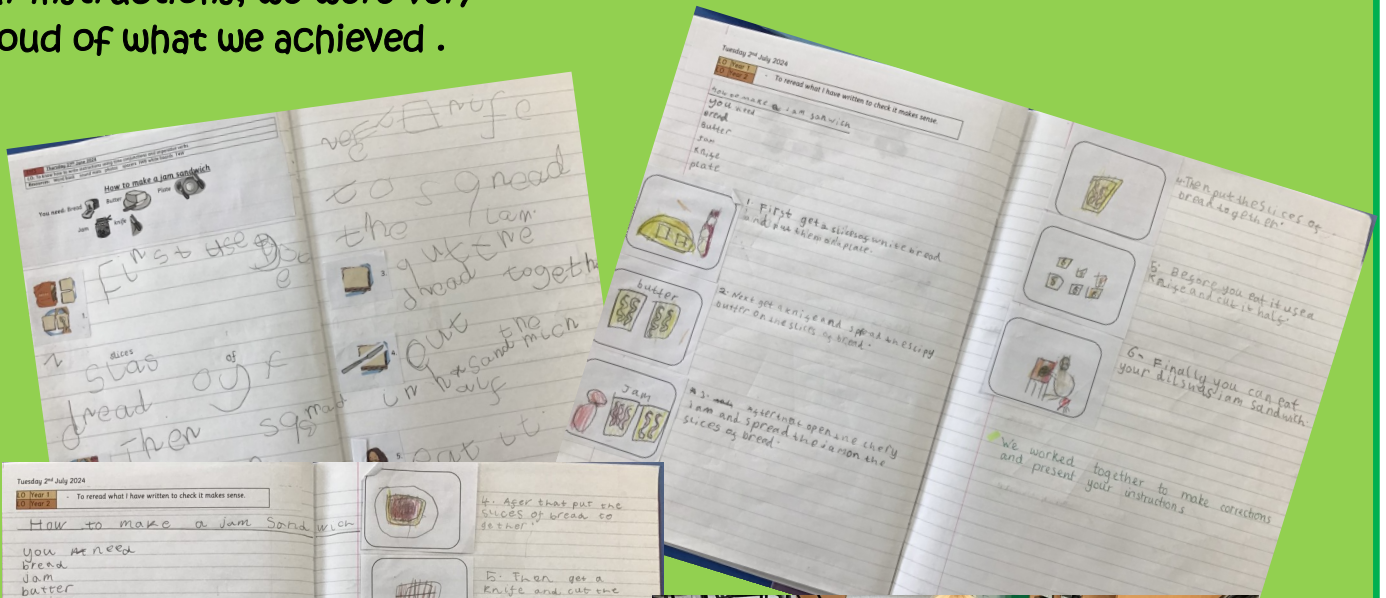
We have practiced our tennis skills in PE, throwing, catching and using a racket.



Our Learning This Week.....Class 1

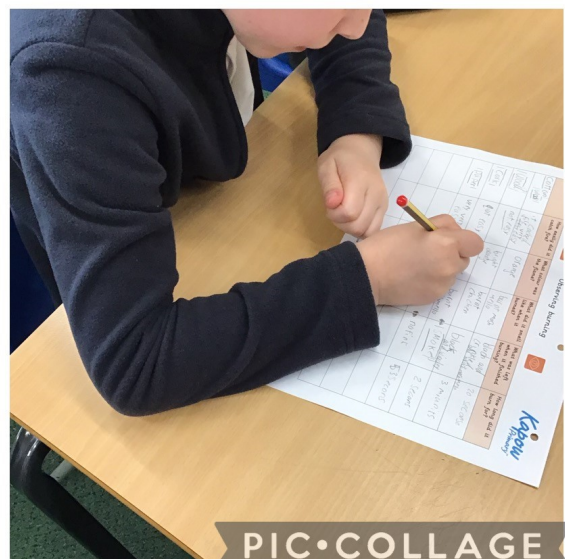

We have had a busy week in Class 2. The children have worked extremely hard to complete their narratives with some great results. We have completed our oceans topic by looking at the Great Pacific Garbage Patch and what we can do to help. In science we looked at irreversible changes and burning of materials. Everyone has been hard at work in maths, with Year 6 on fractions, Year 5 on decimals, Year 4 on addition and Year 3 on mass and capacity. Next week we will begin our DT topic which will involve some cooking and making of foods - the children are very excited!
